Katarzyna Kajdanek recognised in the contest for the best monographic book in urban studies

Dr hab. Katarzyna Kajdanek, prof. UWr of the Institute of Sociology became the laureate of the 3rd Ewa Kaltenberg-Kwiatkowska contest for the best monographic book in urban studies in 2022.

The award was presented to prof. Kajdanek for the book "Powrotnicy. Reurbanizacja w perspektywie przebiegu życia", published by Nomos Publishing House in Kraków. The award recognised the author's excellence in describing the experience of people who decided to return from suburbs to city centres. The author uses diverse, beautiful Polish language making the book valuable both as a scientific work and as a piece of literature.

The key category for Katarzyna Kajdanek involves the experience of the "returners". It's their voice, enhanced with scientific instruments, that is always the focus of this book. By diving into the narratives of residents who resolved to come back from suburbs to city centres, we follow their lives, learn their motivations and survival strategies in the suburban environments and tactics used to escape from it.



Proposals in this edition of the contest were assessed by a jury of four scholars, and the decision was unanimous. The event was organised by the Section of Sociology of the City of the Polish Sociological Association.

Przemysław Żukiewicz is a professor!

The first part of the research results within the project "Life conditions and quality in Wrocław – new residents of the city" has been published.

Conditions and quality of life in Wrocław – new residents of the city



The study by dr hab. Kamilla Dolińska, prof. UWr and dr hab. Julita Makaro, prof. UWr of the Institute of Sociology involved 906 respondents from Ukraine and Belarus, including almost 40% (352) who declared that they would stay in Wrocław for at least one year. The study shows a partial, but very complex and interesting image of the multicultural Wrocław. The interdisciplinary research project is implemented by the municipality of Wrocław (Department of Social Affairs of the Municipal Office of Wrocław, Municipal Strategy Office and Wrocław Centre for Social Development), University of Wrocław (Institute of and Sociology) Stowarzyszenie Edukacji Krytycznej.

The other part of the results will be published in October. Prof. dr hab. Przemysław Żukiewicz

The Greens on the German political stage

"Od partii protestu do partii u władzy. Sojusz 90/ Zieloni na niemieckiej scenie politycznej" is the title of a new publication edited by dr Joanna Trajman of the Institute of International Relations and Security.

More than four decades of the Green party make a good opportunity to sum up its activities and explore transformations it undergoes - both axiologically, in terms of the programme, staff, on the organisational level, as well as the place it holds on the German political stage. The book contains ten papers. The authors focused on various aspects of the Greens' functioning in the Federal Republic of Germany. Among the researchers who contributed to preparation of this publication, there were employees of the Section of German Studies at the Institute of International Relations and Security. Perceiving the unique situation in Austria ruled currently by a coalition of a green party and a conservative party, dr hab. Katarzyna Gelles, prof. UWr presented the increasing position of the Greens on the political stage there in the context of social transformations.



The conditions of operation of Bavarian Greens were explored by dr **Mariusz Kozerski**, while the editor herself, dr **Joanna Trajman** analysed the party's best electoral result in its history, achieved in Bundestag elections in 2021.

The book is especially interesting, as it is the first comprehensive monographic analysis of this party in Polish. We encourage you to read it!

Fantasy fiction in Poland

Fantasy fiction in Poland: first quarter of a century. On social background of literary taste – was the subject of the 34th meeting in the SocjoPercepcja cycle.

The meeting was inspired by the book by Stanisław Krawczyk on the transformation of the Polish fantasy fiction in the late 20th century – "Gust i prestiż". This meeting of SocjoPercepcja, held on 28 June, was attended by employees of the Institute of Sociology: dr Michał Cebula, dr Stanisław Krawczyk and dr Aleksandra Drabina-Różewicz, who moderated the discussion. The discussion concerned the role of popular culture, including fantasy fiction as a carrier of values, patterns of rituals.

The participants considered why fantasy fiction authors and readers choose this genre of literature, what they wrote about and what they didn't (and why), as well as potential consequences for the Polish fantasy fiction in the context of social and cultural transformations. The meeting was organised by Wrocław branch of the Polish Sociological Association and the Institute of Sociology of the University of Wrocław, cooperating with Wrocław Institute of Cul-



ture.

Outstanding citizens of Minsk at the turn of the 19th and 20th century

The Andrej Yanushkevich publishing house published the 12th volume of the series "Znakomici Mińszczanie przełomu XIX i XX wieku. II wojna światowa a Polacy z Mińszczyzny"

The series edited by prof. dr hab. Zdzisław J. Winnicki of the Institute of International Studies and Security presents the history of the last years of Poles in the already Soviet Minsk region, exiled in Poland after the Riga treaty of 1921, as well as emigrating after the war. It is the closure of a multi-year research project and a popularisation attempt meant mostly for readers in modern Belarus frequently unaware of the role played by inhabitants of Minsk at the turn of the 19th and 20th century.



The publication includes an introduction written by the director of the Sybir Memorial Museum prof. **Wojciech Śleszyński**.

Summer School of Democracy: in search of a new understanding of democracy

On 11-15 September, there was another edition of the Summer School of Democracy organised by the Institute of Political Science.

During five days of the school, the participants had a chance to attend lectures and workshops and to share their perspective on various dimensions of democratic processes in times of dynamic technological, social and political changes, as seen at the turn of the 20th and 21st century.

They also visited different places in Wrocław, including the Office of the European Parliament in Poland, museums and other institutions.

The project is funded by Iceland, Lichtenstein and Norway with EEA funds within the Active Citizens Fund – Regional. The leader is Forum for Civic Initiatives Foundation, and other partners include Norwegian Institute for Nature Research and the commune of Polkowice.













Cooperation with Tanzania

The University of Wrocław gained funding for implantation of the academic mobility programme aimed at initiating cooperation with the University of Dar es Salaam in Tanzania. The project, prepared by dr Anna Cichecka of the Institute of Sociology, acquired funding within the Erasmus KA171. This initiative is aimed at internationalisation of universities and intensification of cooperation with institutions from the Global South.

Expert group

Dr hab. Karolina Borońska-Hryniewiecka, prof. UWr of the Institute of Political Science was invited to the international expert group established by think tanks Centre for European Policy Studies (CEPS) & Stiftung Wissenschaft und Politik (SWP). The objective of the group is to develop proposals of changes meant to democratise the European Union.

Research Committee

At the 20th World Congress of the International Sociological Association, dr **Mateusz Karolak** of the Institute of Sociology was elected for the board of the Research Committee no. 44 "Labour movements" within ISA. Dr Karolak will represent the Central and Eastern Europe in ISA RC44.

Ministerial award

Dr **Tomasz Woźniakowski** of the Institute of Political Science was awarded a fellowship of the Minister of Education and Science for outstanding young scientists who have significant achievements in their research.

Scientific internship in California

Field research, interviews and discussions about potential cooperation were all included in the visit plan of dr Marek Musioł of the Institute of International Studies and Security at the University of California Santa Barbara and University of California Berkeley.

In June and July, dr Marek Musioł completed a scientific internship and visit at the two American universities. The programme included interviews, meetings and consultations with authorities and experts at the UC Santa Barbara; holding field research, including at the UC Santa Barbara and UCSB Library, as well as UC Berkeley and Doe Library; presentation of cooperation possibilities, e.g. joint projects, publications and conferences, teaching workshops, development of student and staff mobility programmes, presentation of cooperation possibilities within Wrocław Security Summit 2023.

During the visit, there were also discussions about the research project "The existential nature of water. More politicised or securitised? Regional water security complexes in the Anthropocene".

Quantitative methods school

On 25.06-01.07.2023, the summer school of quantitative methods was held at the Institute of Political Science.

"Summer School: Introduction to statistics with R" was organised by the Centre for Quantitative Research and funded within the Blended Intensive Programme Erasmus+. There were participants from the Institute's partner universities in six countries: Austria (University of Graz), Czechia (Metropolitan University Prague), Ireland (Maynooth University), Lithuania (Vytautas

Magnus University in Kaunas, Vilnius University), Slovenia (School of Advanced Social Studies in Nova Gorica) and Hungary (Corvinus University of Budapest, University of Pécs and University of Szeged). The participants had an opportunity to learn about application of quantitative methods in social sciences, linear regression and logistic regression in R software.

Visiting Los Angeles

The 119th meeting of members of the American Political Science Association was held in Los Angeles.

Among the international guests and lecturers, there were also representatives of the Faculty of Social Sciences. Dr hab. **Michał Jacuński**, prof. UWr of the Institute of Political Science presented a lecture on application of digitalisation in limiting autocratisation in Poland, and prof. dr hab. **Przemysław Żukiewicz**, also of the Institute of Political Science delivered a lecture on inter-party transfers in parliaments in Czechia, Lithuania and Poland.

Migrants as a constituent power in Europe

The journal "Citizenship Studies" (Vol. 27/2023) published an article by dr Łukasz Moll of the Institute of Sociology.

The paper titled "The nomos of mobile commons: towards a nomadic constitution of Europe" presents mobile common goods and migrants as a constituent power of a Europe-tocome. The article is a part of the discussion about the future constitution of Europe in the context of migration.

A political thinker, economist, anti-war activist

We discuss the unique figure of Rosa Luxemburg with dr hab. Katarzyna Gelles, prof. UWr of the Institute of International Studies, who authored a book about one of the best known female social democrats.

Why were you interested in Rosa Luxemburg?

The person to whom I owe my interest in Rosa Luxemburg was my dad, historian by education, expert in German issues and also a passionate explorer of the history of Wrocław. We are both impressed by letters written by Rosa inside Wrocław jail at ul. Kleczkowska, where she was held at the end of WWI, in 1917-1918.

Besides, the history of German social democracy is one of my research areas and here, again, I kept encountering her name as one of the best known representatives of the SPD party. This year marks the 160th anniversary of its establishment and she is listed as one of the most influential members of the party.

And then, a couple of years ago, I was preparing a lecture combining the German and Wrocław themes... and there came Rosa Luxemburg. So, you can say that my interest in her developed over the years and at some point it matured enough for me to write a book about her.

Why did you choose to study this figure?

It's not rare to hear that Rosa Luxemburg, next to Maria Skłodowska-Curie is the best known Polish woman in the world, but it seems to me that very few people know this name now, especially as it doesn't sound Polish. In general, there was not much written about her in Poland and after the political transition – these writings were mostly negative. The main charge concerned her opposition to Poland regaining independence, a decisive factor in the negative evaluation of herself and her work.

I may add that there was a street named after her in Wrocław after 1956, too, but in 1992, within the general decommunization it was renamed after gen. Stefan Grot-Rowecki. This was actually overzealousness by the then local authorities, because Rosa Luxemburg's name is not covered by the so -called decommunisation act.

One can find out quite soon that so far, the Polish-language literature missed a publication presenting this historical figure more in-depth. One biography, a popular science one, was published in mid-1970s, so almost 50 years ago! And in many respects Rosa Luxemburg was an exceptional person, also in her times, at the turn of the 19th and 20th century, she stood out above the average. Even now, we would find her career spectacular.

I am impressed by her independence of thinking, courage in breaking routine conventions, as well as her political writing talent and excellent knowledge of several languages: apart from Polish, she was fluent in Russian and German, she was also familiar with English, French and German. She was a pioneer, one of the first Polish women to obtain a doctoral degree in Switzerland, at the University of Zurich: with such people who pave the way, we -Imean female researchers and academic teachers - may pursue our goals, plans and passions in various areas. This is why in this book I decided to present her not only as a politician and theorist of the labour movement, but also - maybe above all - as a full -fledged woman, with her emotions, experiences, dilemmas, everything she faced in her life of less than 50 years.

How did the work on the book proceed?

It was clear for me from the beginning that I would not analyse her oeuvre or decide on the correctness of her views, as many analysts have addressed those questions before. After studying the materials, I thought how to approach them rightly. I believe that the biggest challenge was to find a way to use them to the full, to choose rightly and set them in order, and to avoid clichés. I relied on my intuition to some extent, because I love reading biographies and I am especially intrigued by those which present their protagonists in a variable manner, not in black and white, leaving it to the readers to assess the protagonists' actions.

One should also remember that outstanding individuals still remain children of their times, so the motives of their successes and failures can be understood only in the context of the reality they lived in.

Presenting Rosa's private life was not an easy task. She did not keep a journal or diary, she was also quite a closed person, so we know little about her childhood and youth. Luckily, there are memories of those who knew her personally, including her long-time friends. Those were very helpful and made an important source of information for me. And so did the vast correspondence between Rosa and her family, friends and labour movement activists all over Europe. I have already mentioned the letters from prison she wrote to her friend Sophie, wife of Karl Liebknecht -Rosa's political companion. I used also the best known biographies written mainly by German scholars, but also English, American, French or Soviet ones.



Rosa Luxemburg is quite an extraordinary character. What do you find particularly special about her?

That's right, she largely diverged from the image of a woman common in her times. Besides, her identification in terms of gender and background, as an educated woman, political activist, and socialist, while also a talented political writer, uncompromising pacifist, with her private life without a husband or children - those were frequently unsurpassable barriers in social life. For example, her adversaries attacked her as a foreigner, and what's more a Jew, she also had problems with such basic issues as renting a flat, because she was not married. But she wouldn't be discouraged. With hard work, she achieved a great success and gained international recognition.

As I stressed in my book, Rosa obviously couldn't predict or even imagine the economic and political transformations to come in the next decades of the 20th century, but many of her views are still up-to-date, including her thoughts on the increasing nationalism with all its consequences, on the essence of political leadership, on social inequalities or her conviction that wars both in the past and nowadays, launched in the interest of minorities, bring only destruction and casualties. The uniqueness of Rosa's life lay mainly in the fact that she went beyond her times in many respects. Regardless of whether she was liked or not, everyone who met her was impressed by her intelligence and character. The tragic circumstances of her death, as she was murdered brutally in January 1919 by right-wing fighters, made her an icon of the labour movement.

It was especially important for me to help readers see Rosa exactly like this: with her temperament, curiosity of the world and openness for people, and at the same time, a person who was sarcastic, stubborn and frequently uncompromising in her views.

USA, Jordan, Georgia or maybe Tanzania?

With the Vice-Dean for International Cooperation, dr hab. Magdalena Ratajczak, prof. UWr, we discuss possibilities of foreign mobility for students of the Faculty of Social Sciences, including exchange programmes, summer schools, conferences and workshops.

Some of our Readers have just started their studies at the University of Wrocław and may be wondering what are the possibilities of foreign mobility offered by the University within its international cooperation?

One of the most popular exchange programmes is ERASMUS+, offering a possibility to study at many European and non-European universities. I really encourage students to apply for this programme. Erasmus offers an opportunity to study at prestigious universities, improves our cultural and language competencies, but it is also a great chance to spend wonderful time abroad and visit new places. Students have also access to the internship offer of CEEPUS, especially if they are interested in countries of Central, Eastern and Southern Europe. One should also remember about government fellowships. Besides, the University has concluded multiple bilateral agreements which cover also student exchange. Finally, there is a broad offer of summer and winter schools. It is good to follow the website of the International Office of the University of Wrocław,

where the news tab includes the offer of programmes, summer and winter schools. For instance, at the moment, enrolment is open for DAAD internships to be realised in Germany, as well as additional enrolment for Erasmus+ for the summer term. The University is also one of the partners of the Argus network, along with universities in Granada, Leipzig, Lyon, Padua, Mihno, Vilnius and Maynooth. At the Arqus website, in "Students" tab you will find a lot of options for students – from online lectures to mobility, summer schools and workshops.

What propositions are there for students of the Faculty of Social Sciences? What should one do to take such an opportunity, where should one apply? All Institutes at the Faculty implement the Erasmus+ programme. We have signed several dozen agreements. We will soon announce the enrolment schedule for the next academic year. Besides, every year we apply for Erasmus+ internships in countries outside the European Union.

This year, we obtained internships in Jordan, USA, Canada and other countries. I recommend contacting programme coordinators - their data are available at the Institutes' websites. For students of M.A. studies at the Institute of International Relations and Security, we offer a double degree programme (two diplomas in two years) at the University in Padua and University in Bochum, and the Institute of Political Science has a similar programme with the University in Tbilisi. There are also many bilateral agreements, including with universities in Ukraine.

What are the Faculty's plans for international cooperation?

In October we are going to sign an agreement with the University of Naples within the double degree programme at the Institute of International Relations and Security. The Institute of Political Science is working on a similar agreement with the University in Leipzig.

Upon the initiative of dr Anna Cichecka, the Institute of Sociology started cooperation with the University in Dar as Saalam, Tanzania – it will also include student and Ph.D. candidates exchange, as well as many lectures and seminars. The Institute of Philosophy enhances its cooperation with Southern Illinois University.

It is very important for us to continue cooperation within agreements we've had for years, including Erasmus Mundus at the Institute of Sociology and at the Institute of International Relations and Security. We also welcome students to attend conferences, workshops and lectures we organise together with our foreign partners.
