# Wrocław Security Summit 2023

On 5-6 December, the Faculty of Social Sciences hosted the international scientific conference "NATO and the EU strategic military and civilian cooperation in the post-Crimean Era". This event was co-funded within the NATO Public Diplomacy Division's Co-Sponsorship Grants and it had the patronage of NATO's Headquarters in Brussels.

This year's event was the third edition of the conference. This time, discussions were mostly devoted to the strategic civilian and military cooperation between NATO and UE after annexation of Crimea in 2014 and the role of these two international actors in maintaining global security. The summit was attended by many scholars and experts from Central-Eastern Europe, United States, Canada, Republic of South Africa, Ukraine, Georgia, Greece, Turkey and Portugal who took part in discussions concerning challenges that face NATO and EU.

Among the subjects discussed, there were enlargement of NATO, cooperation between NATO and EU in the context of the war in Ukraine, challenges associated with China's activities on the international arena, meaning of climate change and sustainable development commitments for NATO and EU.

The conference's honorary patrons were the Rector of the University of Wrocław and the Mayor of Wrocław, while its patrons included the Office of the European Commission in Poland and the Office of the European Parliament in Wrocław.

During the meeting, he spoke about the current situation in Belarus and about the complicated relations between Minsk and Warsaw. The event was coorganised by "Za Wolność Waszą i Naszą" Foundation.

### On globalisation and developmental studies

On 9 and 13 November, the Institute of International Studies and Security welcomed prof. Jan Nederveen Pieterse, professor in sociology and global studies at the University of California, Santa Barbara. # Scientific conference and farewell to prof. Bogusława Dobek-Ostrowska

On 27 October, the Institute of Political Science hosted an international scientific conference "Three decades after the collapse of communism: Central and Eastern Europe on the world map of communication and media research". The event was a chance to bid farewell to the retiring prof. Bogusława Dobek-Ostrowska, for many years the head of the Department of Social Communication and Journalism.

The objective of the event was to discuss forms of distributing publications concerning Central and Eastern Europe and presentation of study results connected to dynamics of the change of media systems in Balkan states. The problems of transformation of media systems at the Balkan Peninsula as well as Romania and Slovenia were explored in the multi-author volume edited by prof. Bogusława Dobek-Ostrowska and prof. Jelena Klaut, published by Peter Lang.



This book, titled "Media Systems in Balkan Countries: Context and Dynamics of Changes" includes a presentation of the political, social, economic and technological conditions in each of the studied countries, referring also to the issues of journalism standards and media responsibility. The event was attended by employees of the University of Wrocław and representatives of many Polish and foreign research institutions.

During the meeting, profesor Dobek-Ostrowska received a souvenir scientific monograph on theory and practice of social communication, developed specifically for this occasion. The event offered an opportunity to thank prof. Dobek-Ostrowska for her contribution to research on social and political communication, as well as for educating generations of students.

# **Cultural security**

Peter Lang Press published the book titled "Cultural security. Theory - Selected Aspects - Case Studies", coedited by dr hab. Elżbieta Szyszlak, prof. UWr of the Institute of International Studies and Security.

# Recognition for prof. Z. J. Winnicki

Prof. Z. J. Winnicki the Institute of International Studies and Security received the medal Reipublicae Memoriae Meritum of the Institute of National Remembrance.

The chapter of the "Reipublicae Memoriae Meritum" medal recognised prof. dr hab. Zdzisław Winnicki for his J. "outstanding merit in public and social activity to commemorate history of the Polish Nation in 1917 -

1990 and to support the Institute in education, science and publishing". The medal was presented at a ceremony on 11 October 2023 at Centralny Przystanek Historia IPN im. Janusza Kurtyki in Warsaw.

# Relationships in the area of culture and heritage protection on the verge of the digital era

Mutual perceptions in Eastern and Western Europe are the subject of the international project within which one working group is led by prof. dr hab. Beata Ociepka of the Institute of International Studies and Security. Dr Julia Trzcińska of the Institute of Political Science is involved in the project, too.

Focusing on confronting the East with the West, the project explores possibilities to build transnational relationships in the area of culture and heritage protection as a pillar of cultural diplomacy. Taking into account six European states - France, the Netherlands, Germany, Poland, Slovakia, Romania – the project analyses mutual perceptions in the east and west of Europe through the prism of intercultural communication.

The project will join scholars and professionals from cultural institutes, artists and representatives of creative industries to explore current difficulties from diverging interpretation of historic events to challenges of digital media revolution. The objective is to develop new strategies, to conceptualise and stimulate intercultural meetings and exchange between the east and west. Results of this cooperation are to enhance the sector of cultural diplomacy through strengthening the role of cultural institutions as mediators of transnational European values; indicate the best and the worst practices to develop recommendations concerning new approaches and strategies, including media strategies. The project supports the inclusive approach to cultural diplomacy to counteract populist discourse and promote European narratives while considering diversity of the cultural heritage.

Prof. dr hab. Beata Ociepka of the Public Diplomacy Lab (Institute of International Studies and Security) at the Faculty of Social Sciences leads one the project's working groups (WP 3). The part of the project implemented at our Faculty is aimed at disclosing postcolonial elements in relationships between various state and non-state entities in the area of cultural diplomacy in Europe and in media debates. Members of WP3 will combine methods of research of European history, mainly French-German and Polish-German relationships with analysing foreign policies (especially cultural and public diplomacy as a tool of foreign policies), as well media and communication studies.

The subject of WP3's analysis of mutual perceptions will involve narratives and interpretation frames, both in current debates and in memory policies in France, Germany and Poland. Based on the postcolonial theory, this part of the project focuses on the question of how power relations and set practices affect cultural diplomacy in such areas as strategic communication (strategic narratives implemented through cultural diplomacy announcements), conflicts concerning memory and cultural heritage, as well bilateral exchange programmes. Implementation of the project started in 2023 and it

## will last 36 months. The consortium is led by prof. **Nicole Coline** of the University in Aix-en- Provence.

## Relationships between EU and Africa – a case study

"Beyond the rhetoric of the partnership of equals. A case study of the European Union's relations with Africa" – is the title of the research project which acquired funding from the National Science Centre within the OPUS 25 scheme. The project's principal investigator is dr hab. Andrzej Polus, prof. UWr of the Institute of International Studies and Security.

The main objective of the project is to build a linguistic lexicometric model for intercultural communication between Africa and the EU. By studying four areas of cooperation: trade, development, security and migration, the model is designed to enable better understanding of how the two parties perceive each other. Thus, the project applies constructivistreflective method as an innovative approach to studying relationships between Africa and EU. A review of the prior literature shows two main problems related

to African studies, as well as research on relationships between Africa and EU. The first problem concerns the status of social constructivism in international relations: it is treated as ontology and not as a method of empirical studies. The other problem involves conceptualisation of violence in international relations, the term that should be updated to enable understanding of the dynamic nature of modern African-European relations.

The present project concerns both those issues, as it treats social constructivism as a middle-range theory and applies epistemic violence theory which serves as an actual alternative for the dominating realist, Marxist and liberal approaches.

OPUS 25 scheme has funded 176 applications out of 2,184 proposals, which means that the success ratio in this call was only 8.06%.

**Project title:** Beyond the rhetoric of the partnership of equals. A case study of the European Union's relations with Africa

## **Research cooperation in Chile**

Most countries of Latin America use the same language, but publication-evidenced scientific cooperation between people from different states on this continent is very rare. Why?

This question will be addressed by dr Stanisław Krawczyk of the Institute of Sociology within the project "Unrecognised forms of international science communication. Regional research cooperation in Chile", funded by the National Science Centre (Miniatura scheme). "I want to explore more closely those forms of scientific activity which are doubtlessly international but can be missed if we use the word 'internationalisation", practically drawing our attention mainly to prestigious publications in English" - says dr Stanisław Krawczyk.

Within the project, dr Krawczyk will interview Chilean scholars who are or were involved in international cooperation within Latin America. This endeavour will be supported by **Carolina Guzmán-Valenzuela**, Chilean researcher of internationalisation.

"I also intend to analyse more closely the term 'internationalisation', applied in Poland. Usually, we think about prestigious publications in English, but cooperation between Chile and Argentina or between Poland and Ukraine is international science, too" – adds dr Stanisław Krawczyk. Dr Krawczyk will travel to Chile in 2024, but he will also implement a similar project in Denmark, this time concerning Nordic states. "I'm happy to be able to combine results of research in different parts of the world and strike contact with people shaped by variable scientific traditions" – he says. Congratulations and we keep our fingers crossed for implementation of the project.

- Climate diplomacy vs. states' climate communication. Perspective of public diplomacy and national branding – dr hab. Marta Ryniejska-Kiełdanowicz of the Institute of International Studies and Security,

- The impact of Russian-Ukrainian war on perception of the Kossack myth among the Russian and Ukrainian diaspora in post-Soviet states. Case study - dr Tomasz Szyszlak of the Institute of International Studies and Security. Congratulations!

#### **Together for Ukraine**

On 18-19 October, there was another meeting of experts within the project "We're there with you - Together for Ukraine". In this project, dr Agnieszka Florczak of the Institute of Political Science represents the University of Wrocław in the working group developing recommendations on solutions to be applied if there is a new wave of refugees. Among the objectives of the project, there is development of mechanisms to cope with questions of migration/ seeking refuge. The project is co-funded by the

European Union with the European Regional Development Fund within the Interreg V-A Czech Republic – Poland programme and it is implemented through cooperation of the Lower Silesian Voivodeship Office – Lower Silesian Marshal's Office, Ukraina Foundation, Liberec Region and Hradec Králové Region.

## Polish vs. American experience in the time of COVID-19

We discuss plans for research in New York, cooperation with Americans concerning methods of coping with post-pandemic reality and Fulbright Commission fellowship with dr hab. Adam Mrozowicki, prof. UWr of the Institute of Sociology who will start his semi-annual research stay in the USA next year.

### - How do you become (allegedly) the only sociologist in Poland nominated for the fellowship of the Polish-American Fulbright Commission?

I think I am not the only sociologist nominated for this fellowship in recent years, but honestly I haven't checked it. For me, this is really a great honour, but also a result of some resolve, because I applied - unsuccessfully - several years ago. For some time, I have wanted to strike closer cooperation with researchers focusing on industrial relations in the USA. I have known some people of the Research Committee on Labour Movements of the International Sociological Association, I also had an opportunity to cooperate previously with professor Virginia Doellgast on one book and within the editing board of the journal "Transfer: European Review of Labour and Research". Further, several years ago, due to the Visiting Professors programme of Wrocław Academic Centre, we invited professor Michael Burawoy of UC Berkeley, I have also known for years professor David Ost from Hobart and William School Colleges in Ithaka where I am going. All these contacts resulted in building a solid basis for my application. And its content arises directly from the need to hold a pilot study for comparative research of quality of working places and methods of coping with postpandemic crises by employees working at public services in the state of New York.

This research will be a development and extension to the American reality of the project *COV-WORK: Socio-economic consciousness, work experiences and coping strategies of Poles in the context of the postpandemic crisis* which I implemented with the funding by the National Science Centre.

## - What does this honour mean? We know you will spend six months at the American Industrial and Labor Relations School at Cornell University? What will you be doing there?

At ILR School I will cooperate with Professor Virginia Doellgast, and my plan includes holding a dozen biographic interviews with employed people at schools, hospitals and nursing homes in the state of New York. I would also love to talk to Amazon staff in the USA, because within the projects I implement in Poland, we have interviewed a dozen employees at logistics hubs. The exact number of interviews will depend on availability of the respondents, in my application I declared between 12 and 20 interviews with people of diverse gender and ethnicity. I would like to start cooperation with ILR Worker Institute in Buffalo and New York; this institution specialises, among others, in education programmes for trade union activists.

I would love to check proximity of the Polish experience of pandemic in industries I study to the American one. For instance, I mean the significant potential of agency, bottomup innovativeness, solidarity and self-organisation of employees facing the pandemic crisis, deficiency of resources and human equipment, as well as weak coordination by the state. I expect many similarities due to the fact that both in Poland, and the USA in the last 20 years public services were subjected to market pressure and neoliberal reforms. Importantly, for the first two months I will be joined in Ithaca by dr Jacek Burski of my Department, who acquired funding for pilot research on internsphysicians in the state of New York within the programme Initiative of Excellence - Research University. I do hope that together we can implement field studies more efficiently, because our target groups overlap and we are experienced in studying them in Poland. I may add that I have also planned short study visits and lectures in the USA: at the Sociology Department of UC Berkeley and at the Graduate School City University of New York.

## - When can we expect results of your cooperation on the project?

The first results will be available early in autumn. At the end of my fellowship, I should provide a report of my stay, describing also the preliminary conclusions of the research. While in the USA, I would really like to prepare an outline of at least one comparative paper concerning the situation in healthcare. I would also like to complete the book based on the COV-WORK project and start working on the theoretical framework of my own book on innovation, control, resistance and normalisation in collective labour relations.

# **Results of the HEU "INCA" research projects**

The project published a report on political foundation of models of capitalism development in Central and Eastern Europe, with Poland as the analysed case.

The researchers involved in the scientific project HEU "INCA" found that variations of the "dependent" capitalism in Central and Eastern Europe were guestioned and transformed by the impact of crises that lasted over a decade with increasing tendencies of state intervention in economy, by aspirations of political decision makers to technologically modernise the Central and Eastern European states, but also by the influence of nonliberal and authoritarian



these governments in states on political decisions (including those concerning economies and societies).

The report was authored by dr hab. Adam Mrozowicki, prof. UW and dr Szymon Pilch of the Institute of Sociology together with dr Edgars Eihmanis of the University of Tartu. You can find more info on the report at:

## Jean Monnet Chair

# From October, Jean Monnet Chair specialising in exploration of representative democracy operates at the Faculty of Social Sciences.

Previously, the Chair functioned at Willy Brandt Centre for German and European Studies.

Jean Monnet Chair is a prestigious grant from the European Union for university professors to create a chair in European studies. Within the 2021 call for proposals, the European Commission established only one Jean Monnet Chair in Poland, and it is at the University of Wrocław. The Chair specialises in exploring European representative democracy in the time of crisis, focusing especially on the impact of the recent economic crisis and pandemic on representative democracy and its institutions in Europe. Besides its research activities, the Chair is involved in teaching and information activities, stimulating public and scholarly debate on modern politics. The recent activities of the Chair included the workshop "Did COVID-19 pandemic contribute to centralisation or decentralisation of power?", and a lecture by dr **Felix Butzlaff** of the Central European University in Vienna concerning the Austrians' attitudes to European integration and crisis of the EU. The latter event was co-organised by the Institute of European Studies.

# A new research and education centre for international cooperation has been launched at the Faculty of Social Sciences.

Cassirer's Centre for International Scholarship and Cooperation (CCISC) is an entity at the Faculty of Social Sciences, operating at the Institute of Philosophy. The Centre's tasks include initiating, holding, supporting and coordinating interdisciplinary research on issues related to phenomena and processes associated with the specific situation of humans in the world (e.g. biological basis for their existence, psychological and anthropological

aspects of the relation between an individual and their cultural and social sphere, universe of symbols and symbolic thinking affecting the human and developing their potential), initiating and coordinating the University's participation in international research programmes related to the Centre's scope of activities, as well as education and popularisation (e.g. organising lectures, workshops, conferences).

The Centre intends also to deepen cooperation with a network of international societies of research of imagination, as well as entities at various research institutions, including the University of Aberdeen, University of Essex, Institut de Recherches Philosophiques (Lyon), and St Petersburg University.
